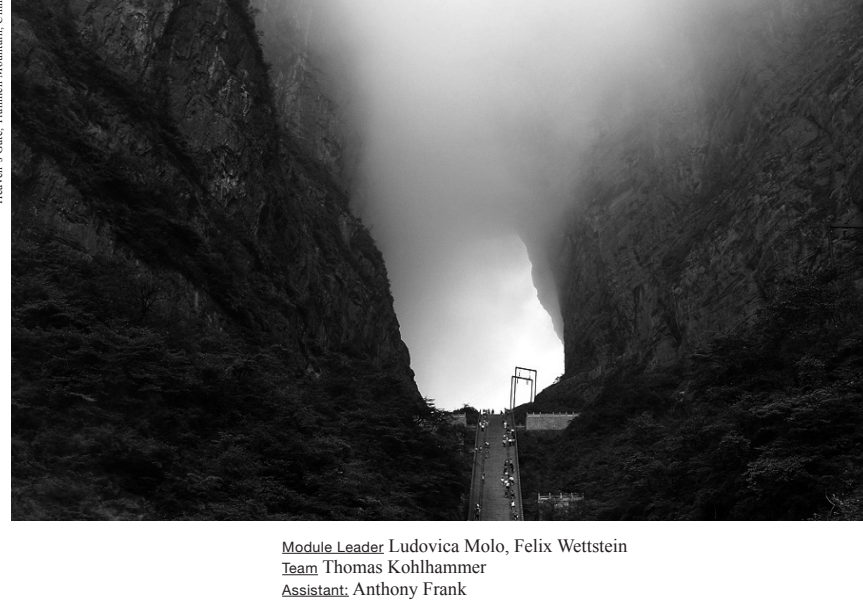

Infrastructure as landscape: not just another parking lot
A compact, well-preserved village has managed to integrate contemporary architecture in its historical building substance. But times have changed and traffic volumes are constantly increasing. The peace and delicate balance are

traffic volumes are constantly increasing. The peace and delicate balance are under threat. We can see this scenario throughout the entire Alpine region. The village in the Canton of Ticino is called Carona, but it could also be elsewhere. Carona, a picturesque village on the southern flank of the San Salvatore, is a magnet for tourists, a place for local recreation and an attractive residential location. Tourism and its effects on transport pose great challenges to the municipality. The aim is to insert the necessary infrastructure into the highly sensitive landscape and building substance, specifically asking the following questions:

- How do we approach the compact, intact and protected village?
- How do we design the entrances to and the transitions between landscape

- How do we design the entrances to and the transitions between landscape and building substance?
- How do we handle the traffic volumes?
